Life's Path





The devil has been circulating fake news about God and his work on earth ever since. The devil's main objective is to deceive and keep people from discovering the way, the truth and the life that is found in Jesus Christ.

Jesus warned of this threat, "For false messiahs and false prophets will appear and perform great signs and wonders to deceive, if possible, even the elect." Matthew 24:24 One thing that is critically important to realize is that not everyone speaking forth on behalf of God is telling the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth.

Because there are pretenders, God had the apostle John write, "Dear friends, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, because many false prophets have gone out into the world." 1 John 4:1

Destined to win, Larry Snavely God often calls us to follow a certain path, but a couple of things we need to remember about that path. First, the path that God is calling us on through His Holy Spirit will always concur with His Word. God will NEVER direct us on a path that in any way opposes His Word. Second, the path that God directs us to will be narrow, have difficulties, and will teach us to depend on Him more and more every day. In general, if we are on a path where the flow seems fairly easy and there are many people all going the same direction, we are probably on the wide path and need to take the first exit onto the narrow path. *There is a way that seems right to a man, but in the end it leads to death.* Proverbs 16:25.

God is not a genie. He leads us on a path that leads to Him while bringing others with us on the way. He is a loving father who cares intimately about us. Search your heart, listen to the call of the Holy Spirit, and step through that narrow gate. It will lead on a path of loving God, serving others, and growing closer to Him each day.
