Preachers are supposed to quote the great theologians like C.S. Lewis, Frederick Buechner, and Dietrich Bonhoeffer, but I learned a deep theological principle about servanthood from that great western theologian, Louis L'Amour. Hey, I get my sermon material where I can! In the West, the stagecoach was a major form of transportation. Did you know that stagecoaches had three different kinds of tickets—first-class, secondclass, and third class?

If you bought a firstclass ticket that meant you could sit down, no matter what happened. If the stagecoach got stuck or a wheel came off or the axle broke, the first class ticket holders remained seated at all times.

Second-class ticket holders could sit down until there was a problem. Then they had to get off, but stood in the shade and watched others fix the problem. When the problem was fixed they reboarded the stagecoach.

Those with thirdclass tickets could sit until there was a problem. When they got off, they had to help fix the problem. If the coach was stuck in the mud, third-class ticket holders had to help get it unstuck. If the stagecoach had to be pushed up a hill, third-class holders had to push. If the wheel broke, third-class ticket holders had to be a human jack and hold up the stagecoach so the wheel could be replaced.

Think about it!
There's a sermon in there someplace. Let me reach in and try to pull it out. This is exactly how some people relate to the church. Some think they have a first-class ticket. Let's call them "Sit in Saints." They just sit there and expect to be served, to be fed, wait-

A Lesson in Love

"What a jerk," I thought as I hung up the phone. Not a very spiritual reflection for a pastor, but that's the way I felt nonetheless. I was just concluding a counseling session and was trying desperately to prepare a Bible study for the evening service on "Love One Another" from John 13:34-35. It wasn't coming together.

The caller had identified himself as Ernest F. Thomas, "as in doubting Thomas," he told me. He was traveling between Oregon and Phoenix, the

45 year-old unbelieving son of a minister, needing--no, demanding--a motel room due to medical problems. Because I couldn't listen to his story right then he rudely impugned my Christianity, as well as the faith of fifteen other ministers he allegedly had called. He was insulting, insistent, and, in spite of the 185 I.Q. he claimed, a real pain.

When he called back ten minutes later as we had agreed, I can't say I was looking forward to talking to him. But God had been talking to me. Thinking of Ernest as a jerk had jolted me. The verse I had been studying was starting to come home. "Love one another, even as I have loved you."

How did Jesus love? He taught us to love those who mistreat us. If He hadn't practiced what He preached, I would have had no chance. "Greater love has no man than this, that a

man lay down his life for his friends," He told His disciples (John 15:13), yet He exceeded man's best by dying for His enemies (Romans 5:8). Jesus doesn't love on the basis of our worthiness.

Transients who chronically call churches for help are perplexing. Must a person be deserving for me to love him with practical help? No. God doesn't operate that way-He loves radically. So must we. "Love one another, even as I have loved you."


