From an interview between Rick Lawrence and John Eldridge.

Rick: What do you like and not like about the conventional way we interpret discipleship?

John: Jesus quotes Isaiah 61 to announce that we will be the centerpiece of His mission. He wants to heal our broken humanity and release us from all forms of darkness in bondage. In the church, if these were our discipleship goals, then you would see people restored into the brilliant of life human beings they were created to be,

that's not merely a transfer of knowledge.

Rick: What insights do you have about leading people into a hard first relationship with Jesus and others?

John: We have to start with the premise that humanity is traumatized, absolutely traumatized. I think we make a mistake of thinking we're starting with a fairly healthy group of people and we're just trying to kind of get them further along in their life with God. That is a very faulty assumption. You look under the hood in any small group, and there is massive, massive trauma. abuse, addictions, broken relationships, and sexual trauma. Getting at the heart is difficult for people because they've been so badly wounded. But that brings us back to the central mission of Jesus. He has come to heel broken hearts. Humanity has been absolute traumatized by the evil Trinity: the world, the flesh, and


