Conclusion to the May article:

4. The resurrection establishes an absolute standard for truth. Many in the postmodern world suggest there is no definitive right and wrong. One person's truth claims are just as valid as another. One religion is just as good as another. One culture's values are just as legitimate as another. The Apostle Paul informed the intellectual elite in Athens about his encounter with the one true God. He concluded, "For He has set a day when He will judge the world with justice by the man He has appointed. He has given proof of this to all men by raising Him from the dead" (Acts

17:31). God will not judge us by majority opinion, personal feelings, or legal decrees. He will judge us by the perfect standard of Jesus Christ who insisted, "I am the truth." No wonder God makes belief in Jesus' resurrection the ultimate requirement for salvation. "If you confess with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and *believe in your heart* that God has raised him from the dead, uou will be saved" (Romans 10:9). 5. The resurrection has positively transformed millions of lives. The disciples became so convinced that Jesus

was alive again that they were dramatically transformed from fearful deserters to courageous martyrs. Down through the centuries, born-again believers from Saul of Tarsus to Lee Strobel have been remarkably transformed by the resurrected Jesus. "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation: the old has gone, the new has come" (2 Cor. 5:17). 6. The resurrection provides a daily purpose for our lives. The Apostle Paul reasoned, "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins... If only for this life we have hope




