Indeed, it is true that God's people should not be bound by ineffective traditions or extrabiblical rules. Jesus warned the Pharisees, "And you experts in the law, woe to you, because you load people down with burdens they can hardly carry, and you yourselves will not lift one finger to help them" (Luke 11:46). Yet lately, I've wondered why rails are rarely replaced. Why are the standards rarely increased? Once the bar is lowered, it is seldom raised again—even a little.

Occasionally there should be times when we conclude we are without sufficient guardrails. Maybe we should provide more protection—and ultimately more freedom—by replacing some of the rails we cavalierly removed. I suspect anyone who would dare suggest such a thing would be quickly ridiculed and canceled.

Consider as an example the furious response to the Supreme Court decision to overturn Roe v. Wade. The visceral reaction from those outraged at any effort to limit the freedom to kill unborn babies is evi-
