So, counselors and psychiatrists worked to bring their patient's minds into accord with the reality of their bodies. Any less counsel would threaten their wellbeing. Why would we treat a fellow human being suffering from genderdysphoria any differently? Instead of recommending hormones or surgical reconstruction, why not address the mental incongruency of minors and help counsel them to accept their biological reality?" Indeed.
