

Helen Roseveare had been a missionary in the Congo for 20 years. She was speaking at a conference when she shared this story. One night we worked hard helping a mother in labor. In spite of all our efforts, we were not able to save the mother. We were left with a tiny, premature baby and a crying two-year-old big sister. There was no electricity to run an incubator. Yes, it's true, the Congo is hot, but it can get cool

at night and frequently, there is a cool breeze. A box was gathered and some cotton wool to try to keep the baby warm, hot water bottle would be filled with warm water to help keep the chill away. The nurse who went to fill the water bottle, came back soon almost in tears. The water bottle had burst



while she was trying to fill it. How many more things could go wrong? The phrase "no crying over spilled milk" came to mind, so we just kept doing what needed to be done to keep this little one alive. The baby made it through the night. I went on with my usual tasks, one of which was getting together with some of the orphans from the area. As often with these children, we would play games and then have a little time of study and a prayer. I gave the youngsters some things to pray about. I also mentioned about the little baby that had been born the day before and about all the things that had gone wrong, I told them about her big sister and all of her tears at losing her mom. One of the girls, a 10-yearold girl during our prayer time prayed this prayer, "Please" God, send us a water bottle. It'll be no good tomorrow, God, the baby will be dead, so please send it this afternoon." She also added to her prayer, "And while you're about it, God,

Helen went on with her day's activities when she received a message that a package had been dropped off at her house. She ran home to check on the package. Helen lifted from the package brightly colored, knitted jerseys to be handed out to the orphans. There were bandages for leprosy patients. There were mixed raisins and nuts. They would go well in the bread and buns that would be made for the kids to eat that week. Helen's hand went into the box again and that's when she grasps and pulled it out. It was a brand-new rubber hot water bottle. One of the set of eyes that was watching her unpack the box were those of the little girl who had prayed that ridiculous prayer earlier. When she saw the water bottle pulled out, she cried out that surely there must be a doll in there as well. Helen continued to unpack the box, and I suppose you know where this is going. The last item that she pulled out was a small doll. The little girl asked, "Can I go over with you, and give the girl the doll so that she will know Jesus really loves her?" That parcel had been on its way for over five months. It was packed by a former Sunday school class where Helen had gone years earlier. One person in the class had been prompted to pack a rubber, hot water bottle. Another had been prompted to pack a baby doll.
